Program overview

This program is designed to improve women's health including, but not limited to, birth equity, trauma informed care, birthing positions, benefits to vaginal birth and resources for fetal demise.

Objectives

- Define birth equity.
- Describe the impact of birth equity on western Kansas mothers.
- Explore how nursing staff can identify the difference between equity and equality and how that impacts patient care.
- Identify improvements in patient care when using a trauma-informed care approach.
- Recognize signs and symptoms of trauma exposure on physical and mental health.
- Discuss signs and symptoms of trauma exposure for the pregnant patient.
- Explore the impact of birth related trauma on patient care and health outcomes.
- Review trauma informed care practices that nurses can incorporate in caring for patients during prenatal and labor and delivery care.
- Identify benefits to movement in childbirth.
- Examine care practices that support childbirth.
- Explore birthing positions to help facilitate vaginal delivery.
- Examine the steps for pregnant women to take to improve all stage of pregnancy.
- Explore the benefits to vaginal birth.
- Review history of vaginal birth practices.
- Discuss importance of patient and provider communication in preparation for childbirth.
- Explore the pros and cons of labor induction.
- Explore complications of vaginal birth.
- Examine vaginal birth verse cesarean section.
- Identify gestationally appropriate care for the family experiencing fetal demise.
- Review resource options for families with a fetal demise.
